Report on the Talk by Professor Davy Cielen

He shared a research study that illustrated how women tend to show more fear towards technology, while this is up for debate. He also showcased a study where researchers tried to understand the likelihood that AI will consider us as a threat, which was found to be low, despite reports of a Google AI project becoming sentient.

During his talk, Professor Cielen emphasized that AI will never be able to replace jobs that require empathy, creativity, intuition, and compassion. These are human traits that machines are not capable of replicating. He also touched upon the need for legislation to regulate the use of AI and the importance of human-centric AI for social good.
